Aims

AIM:

• To promote awareness and understanding of mental health issues, emphasizing the importance of access to mental health services during catastrophes and emergencies, and to encourage positive attitudes toward mental well-being among students and the community.

Objectives of the Program

Objectives

- To educate participants about the program's core theme: "Access to Services Mental Health in Catastrophes and Emergencies."
- To enhance knowledge regarding mental health challenges faced during crises and the available support systems (as covered in the Guest Lecture).
- To develop skills in recognizing and managing mental health issues through interactive sessions and practical demonstrations (e.g., MSE Demonstration and Roll Play).
- To encourage participation in creative and educational activities that foster emotional expression and teamwork (e.g., Poetry, Slogan, Art, Reels, and Rangoli Competitions).
- To promote empathy, resilience, and mental well-being among nursing students and the wider community (through the Roll Play and Theme Opening).
- To recognize and reward active participation and innovative contributions during the awareness week (via Price Distribution).

Day 01 Report: Theme Opening: Launching the Mental Health Awareness Week

The inaugural day of the World Mental Health Awareness Week successfully set a creative and insightful tone for the program.

The day began with the **Theme Opening**, which successfully took place from **10:00 AM to 11.00 AM**. The event was formally inaugurated by the college leadership: **Prof. Vishakha Ganvir (Principal)**, **Prof. Ashwini Vaidya (HOD of Mental Health Nursing)**, and **Mr. Pravin Kolhe (Administrator)**. They were joined by faculty from the Mental Health Nursing Department, other departmental faculty members, and participating students. **Ms. Payal Hande and Ms. Shweta Landage** successfully moderated the session, during which the critical theme for the week, "**Access to Services** – **Mental Health in Catastrophes and Emergencies**," was formally introduced to all attendees.

Following the Theme Opening, concurrent creative competitions were immediately held, engaging students in artistic expressions of the week's theme. The competitions and their respective judges were:

- Poetry Competition: Evaluated by Mr. Piyush Wagh and Ms. Snehal Jambulkar.
- Slogan Competition: Judged by Ms. Jayashree Jadhao and Ms. Sunita Mirpagare.
- Photography Competition: Evaluated by Mr. Sumit Nirmal and Ms. Malathi S.

These activities successfully encouraged nursing students to channel their understanding of the theme into powerful artistic expressions. The robust participation fostered emotional engagement and dialogue around the often-neglected aspects of mental health in emergency situations. The vibrant atmosphere immediately highlighted the commitment to **breaking the stigma** surrounding mental health. The program for the day concluded with a photo session.

Day 02 Report: DEDICATED TO GUEST LECTURE LED BY AN EXPERT

The second day of the Mental Health Awareness Week at Godavari College of Nursing, Jalgaon, was dedicated to an educational session in the form of a Guest lecture. The session commenced at 10:00 AM in Dr. Akshata Patil Hall with a warm welcome address delivered by the coordinator, Ms. Shilpa Waghmare.

Dr. Aditya S. Jain, Resident Doctor from the *Department of Psychiatry*, (DUPMCH), was invited as the guest speaker. He delivered an insightful lecture on the topic "Psychiatric Emergency." During the session, Dr. Jain elaborated on the meaning, common types, causes, and management strategies of psychiatric emergencies. He also discussed the importance of accessibility to mental health services during emergencies and emphasized the need for multidisciplinary collaboration in addressing mental health challenges during catastrophic events.

The lecture was highly interactive, with students actively participating in discussions and asking relevant questions. The session greatly enhanced the understanding of nursing students regarding the significance of mental health care in emergency situations and motivated them to apply this knowledge in their professional practice. The program concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Ms. Shilpa Waghmare, expressing heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Jain for his valuable contribution. Certificates were presented by Prof. Ashwini Vaidya, Head of the Department, who also extended thanks to all participants for their enthusiastic involvement.

Day 03 Report: DEDICATED TO DEMONSTRATION LED BY AN EXPERT

The third day of the Mental Health Awareness Week at Godavari College of Nursing, was dedicated to a crucial practical session in the form of a Demonstration. The session commenced sharply at 10:00 AM in Akshata Patil Hall with a warm welcome address delivered by the coordinator, Ms. Shilpa Waghmare.

Prof. Ashwini Vaidya, Head of the Department of Mental Health Nursing (G.C.O.N), was the esteemed facilitator for the session. She led an insightful and comprehensive **Demonstration on Mental Status Examination (MSE)**, a cornerstone skill for psychiatric nurses.

During the session, **Prof. Ashwini Vaidya** meticulously walked the students through the structured yet flexible process of conducting an MSE. She elaborated on:

- Systematic Assessment: The importance of methodically observing and documenting the patient's Appearance, Behavior, Speech, Mood and Affect.
- Cognitive and Thought Processes: Practical techniques for assessing Thought Content and Process, Perception, and Cognitive Functions (e.g., orientation, memory).
- Clinical Application: How to use the MSE to form a preliminary clinical impression and guide further nursing interventions.

The demonstration was highly **interactive**, and Q&A, with students actively participating to clarify techniques and understand in clinical observation. The session greatly enhanced the **practical assessment skills** of the nursing students, preparing them to apply this foundational knowledge directly in their professional practice.

The program concluded with a **vote of thanks** proposed by **Ms. Shilpa Waghmare**, who expressed heartfelt gratitude to **Prof. Ashwini Vaidya** for her valuable contribution and practical expertise.

DAY 4: Community Role Play on Access to Mental Health in Emergencies

The event commenced with an introductory address by a faculty member, emphasizing the week's significance and the critical need for community-level mental health preparedness. Students then showcased their talents and understanding of the theme through various dramatic performances.

Role Play & Evaluation

The nursing students delivered compelling and informative Role Plays that depicted scenarios like:

- The psychological impact of a disaster on individuals and families.
- Barriers to seeking mental health support in a crisis (e.g., stigma, lack of information).
- The appropriate role of a community health worker or nurse in providing **psychological first aid** and connecting victims to available resources.

The creativity, clarity of message, and clinical accuracy of the students' performances were evaluated by an expert panel from the department:

- Ms. Hemangi Murkute, Associate Professor (GCON)
- Ms. Malathi Sakthivel, Associate Professor (GCON)

The evaluators assessed the students on their acting, script relevance to the theme, and ability to effectively communicate complex mental health concepts to a lay audience. The evaluation process was highly instructional, with the judges providing feedback to enhance the students' future educational activities.

The activity was highly successful, serving the dual purpose of **Community Education:** Effectively conveying the critical message of **mental health accessibility** to the residents of Tarsod Community.

The entire faculty team supervised the event, ensuring smooth coordination and interaction with the community members, who participated enthusiastically. The program concluded with a vote of thanks, acknowledging the community's cooperation and reiterating the college's commitment to mental health awareness.

Day 5 Report: Creative Competitions and Culmination Ceremony

The Mental Health Awareness Week organized by the Department of Mental Health Nursing at Godavari College of Nursing, reached its inspiring finale on October 10th, 2025, with a day dedicated to creative competitions and a formal prize distribution ceremony.
