REPORT ON:-NATIONAL VIRTUAL CONFERENCE - (07/02/2022 - 08/02/2022)

INTRODUCTION

World cancer day aims to prevent millions of deaths each year by raising awareness and education about cancer.

Cancer not only kills the person but also kills the happiness in the family, don't let it ruin your loved ones.....

This year on world cancer day National Virtual conference was organized by the department of Medical Surgical Nursing from 7th to 8th February 2022.

The theme of the conference was Close the care Gap- an overview of evidence based practice in cancer.

A total of 700 candidates participated in the conference pan India, including the Teaching faculties, Nursing officers & Nursing students.

Conference included five plenary sessions & a session on scientific paper presentation.

PROCEEDINGS

OPENING SESSION

Conference was hosted by Ms. Rashmi Tembhurne, Lecturer.

The opening session was addressed by Dr. Mousmi Lendhe Madam, Principal,GCON, who addressed the audience regarding the conference and declared the conference officially at the end of her statement.

This was followed by traditional lamp lighting & inauguration of the conference.

- Ms. Menaka SP Madam, Vice Principal, GCON unveiled the theme of the conference, **“Close the care gap- An overview of evidence based practice in cancer”** in which she has revealed all about understanding and recognising the inequities in cancer

care around the globe. Income, education, location and discrimination based on ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability and lifestyle are just a few of the factors that can negatively affect care, were views of Ms. Menaka SP Madam regarding the theme.

Also, how research can help in overcoming the future challenges related to cancer treatment and care.

Further, Ms. Manorama Kashyap facilitated the discussion, inviting the speakers to reflect on different aspects of CANCER.

SESSION I: - Cancer-Causes and Prevention

A brief overview on the causes of cancer and its preventive measures was given by Mr. Raveesh Kumar; Prof. & Head, Department of Medical Surgical Nursing Govt. College of Nursing, KIMS Vidyanagar, Hubli (Karnataka)

In his session, Professor Kumar gave a brief overview of the current knowledge on the causal links between risk factors of cancer and its prevention. He presented the magnitude of the effects of the risk factors on adult health, explaining the methodology of common types of cancer, global causative factors for cancer.

Professor Kumar also identified the steps to prevent cancer & emphasized on why screening tests is mandatory for cancer detection.

Mr. Raveesh recommended increased research to fill the gap between knowledge and practice,

As a prime example focusing on the evidence based practice sir has illustrated the study on “realizing the potential of cancer prevention- the role of implementation science”, & “cancer prevention for next generation.”

SESSION-II: - Latest Treatment Modalities

The discussion was introduced by a brief presentation on the latest treatment modalities by Dr. Parag Ingle, MBBS, MS (General Surgery) Mch (Surgical Oncology), HCG NCHRI Cancer Center, Nagpur (M.H.)

The main points that emerged during the discussions are outlined below.

- Conventional treatment modalities for cancer including surgical therapy, radiotherapy and chemotherapy.

Latest treatment modalities for cancer:-

- Robotic cancer surgery
- Immunotherapy
- Targeted therapy
- CAR T- Cell therapy &
- Proton therapy

SESSION- III: - Complementary and Alternative Therapy in Treatment of Cancer

Dr. Megha Wakode; Co-Founder & Director Holistic Healing Center, Nagpur (M.H.), addressed the third session and explained the importance of alternative therapy in the treatment of cancer.

Her session began with an activity in which she has indulged all the participants to meditate for few seconds; this was quite a relaxing moment for all.

Dr. Megha had outlined her content under the following headings:-

- What is complementary and alternative therapy?
- Alternative therapy for cancer treatment (Accupunture, aromatherapy, massage, naturopathy & meditation)
- Role of Diet and herbs
- Mind body medicine. (Guided imagery & Hypnosis)

DAY- II

SESSION-IV: - Safety of Nurses Exposed To Various Therapies

Mrs. Anita D' Souza Prof. cum principal, Tata Memorial (Mumbai); made a presentation on the importance of safety measures for nurses exposed to various therapies.

She also emphasized on the effect of cytotoxic drugs, routes of exposure of cytotoxic drugs, PPE, steps to follow while separating syringe from the vial, to aspirate drug without separating the syringe, spill kit to avoid cytotoxic spillage & safe disposal of cytotoxic drugs.

Mrs. D' Souza mentioned about radiation therapy, its effects & principles of radiation protection & protective measures,

Finally she concluded her session by saying "let's care for ourselves for we care for others."

SESSION-V: - Cancer and COVID -19

The speaker for this session was Dr. Sweta. N. Bhoskar, Professor Govt. College of Nursing, Indore (M.P.).

Prof. Sweta Bhoskar initiated her session with the review of corona virus and cancer.

She included the results from the recent research study done in Wuhan, China on cancer patients.

Dr. Sweta has mentioned "some people with cancer are more at risk of being seriously ill if they develop COVID-19".

Some major points which were discussed by Dr. Sweta were

- Recognize the symptoms of corona virus in cancer patients
- Identify who are at major risk
- Institution care
- Taking care of mental health
- Describe issues and challenges in oncology care with COVID- 19

At the second last stage of the conference there was a scientific paper presentation. Ten candidates came up with their excellence in research paper presentation.

Dr. Mousmi Lendhe madam & Dr. Sweta Bhoskar madam were the judges of the scientific session.

Certificate was disseminated to all the presenters of scientific session and participants of the conference and one best paper was awarded.

Mr. Shreenath Kulkarni's paper was awarded as the best research paper by the judges of scientific session.

Finally, the second and the last day of the conference was concluded by the valedictory function.

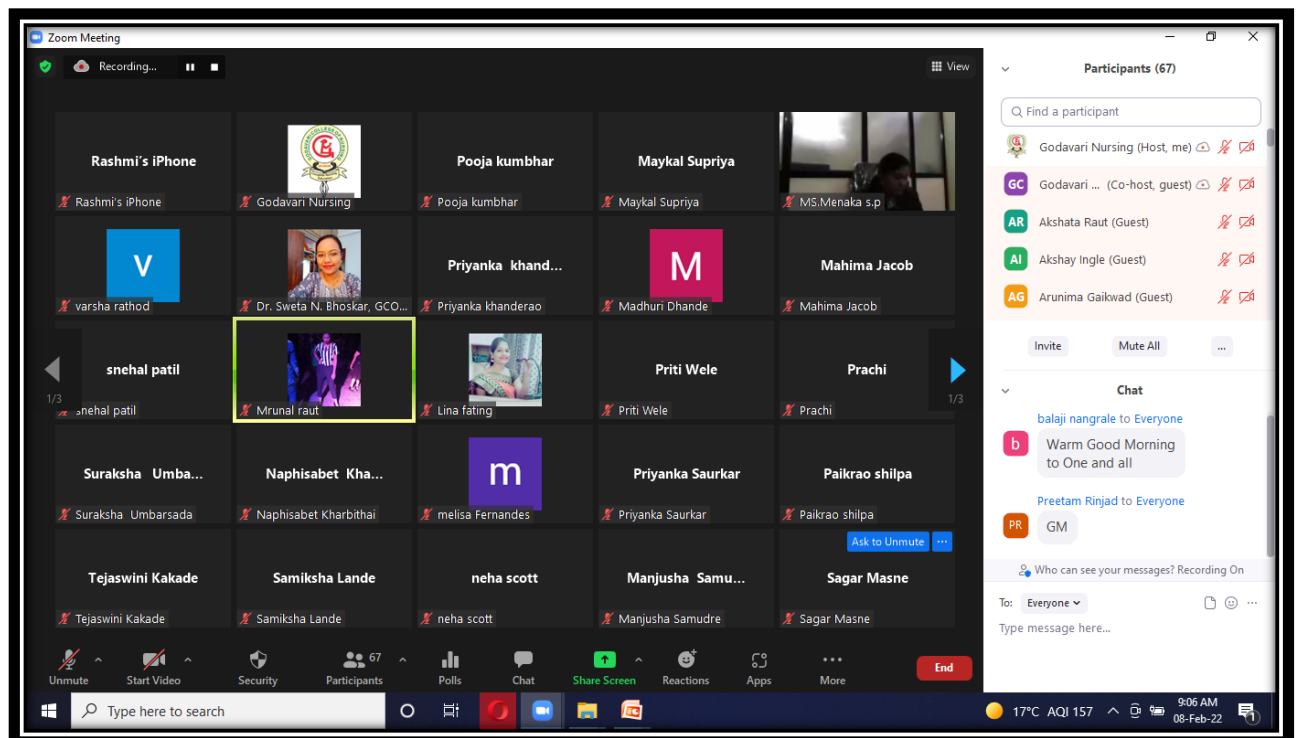


Fig. 01- Participants of National Virtual Conference

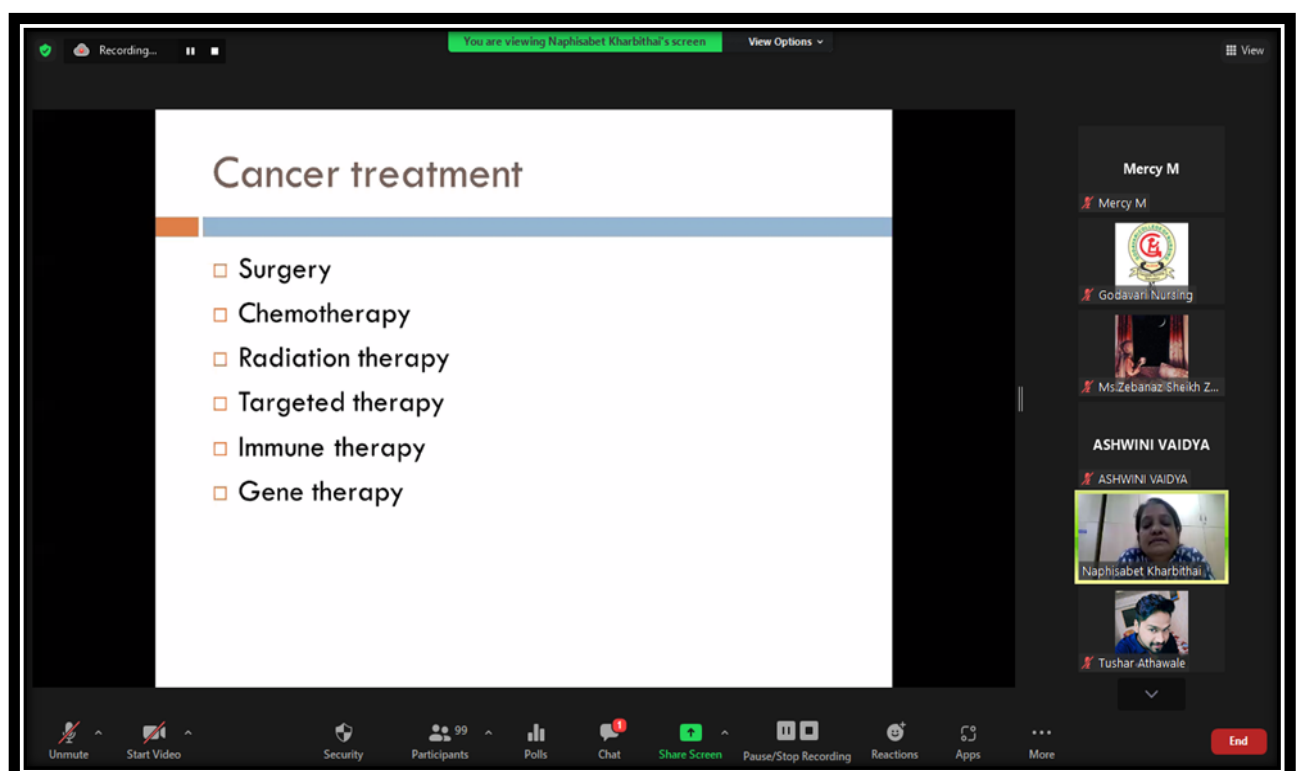


Fig. 02- Speaker talk on- Cancer treatment

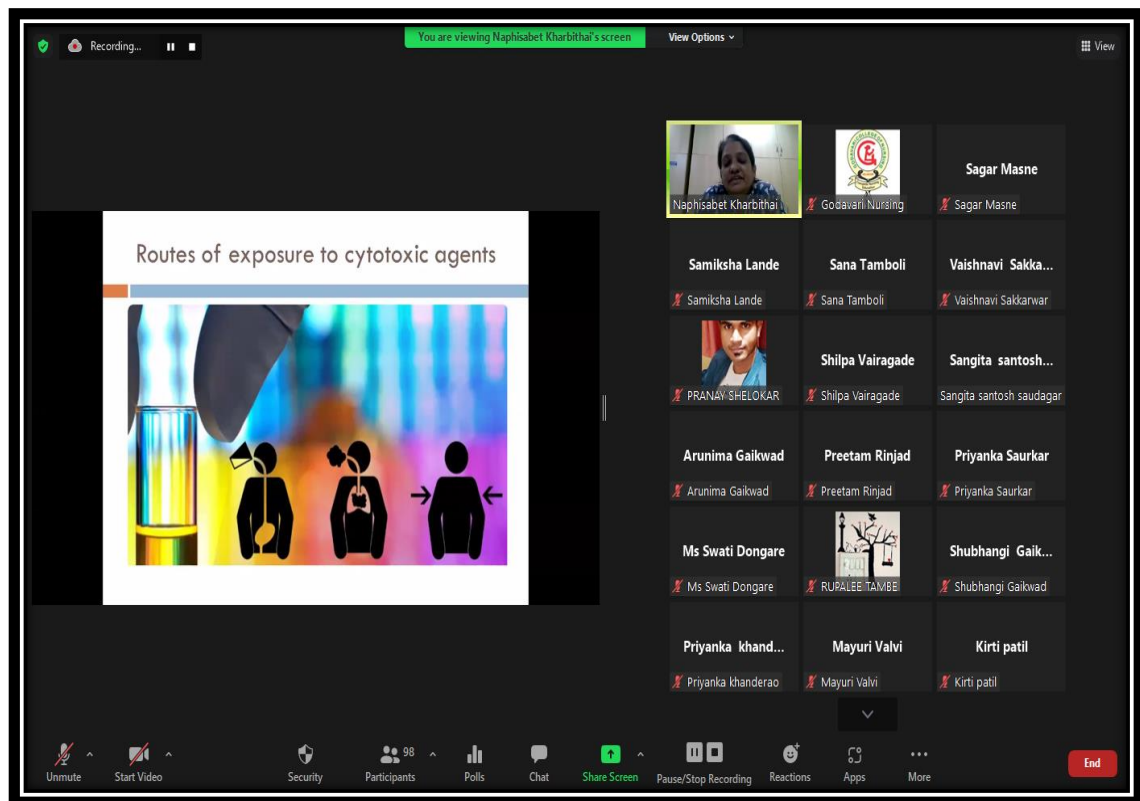


Fig. 03- Speaker dealing with the topic

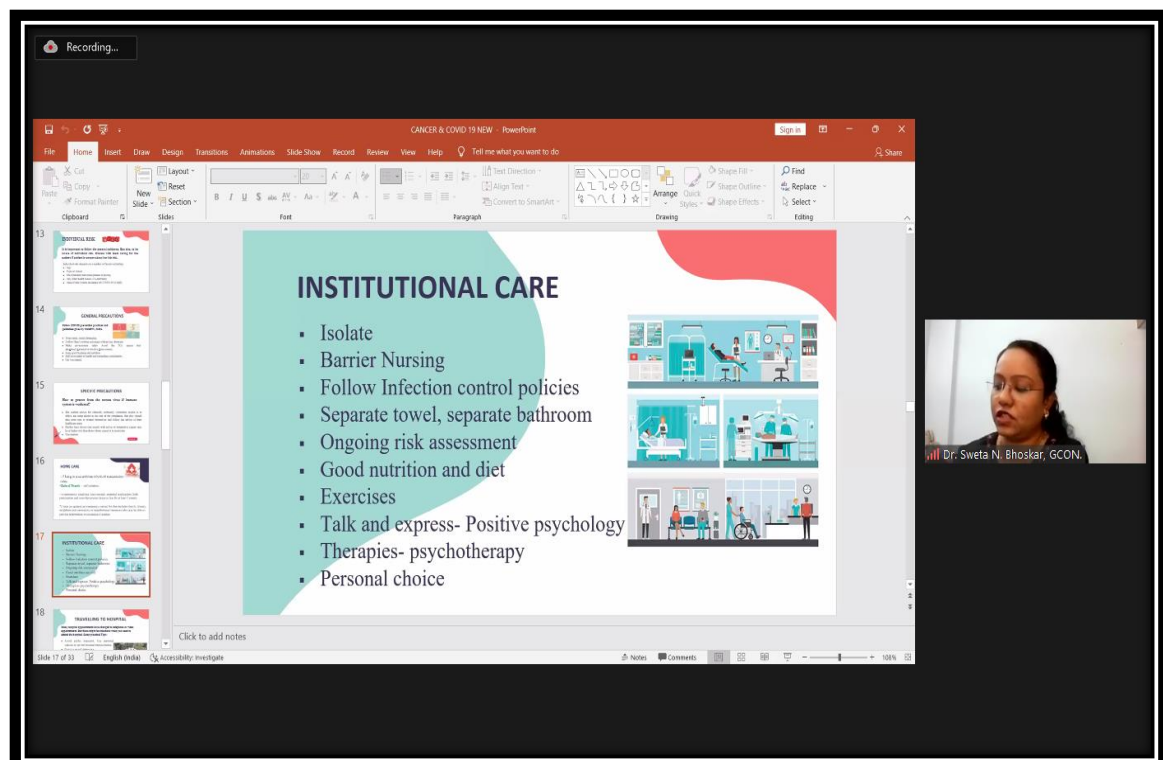


Fig. 04- Speaker talk on- Institutional care
