A **Ph.D. scholar** with a Master's in Child Health Nursing, she brings extensive experience in nursing education, mentoring, and clinical practice. Her scholarly and practical insights into managing conflict within academic institutions provided immense value to the webinar.

Webinar Highlights

- The webinar commenced with a warm welcome address by the faculty of Godavari College of Nursing, highlighting the relevance of the topic in today's evolving educational ecosystem.

- **Mrs. Kamini Pise** began by introducing the concept of **conflict**, identifying its types—interpersonal, intrapersonal, organizational—and root causes within nursing institutions.
- She provided real-life examples from educational and clinical settings where conflict situations emerged, demonstrating how they were managed or mismanaged.
- The speaker emphasized the **importance of active listening, empathy, clarity in communication, and negotiation skills** in de-escalating conflict.
- She aligned her discussion with **National Education Policy 2020**, which advocates for **holistic and multidisciplinary education, collaborative learning, leadership development, and inclusive practices**—all of which require effective conflict resolution.
- Practical strategies such as **assertive communication, mediation, problem-solving frameworks (like win-win strategies)**, and **peer dialogue** were discussed.
- Students were encouraged to view conflict not as a barrier but as an **opportunity to learn, reflect, and grow**—individually and as a team.
- A special segment was included for faculty members, focusing on **classroom management, interdepartmental coordination, and mentoring students through disputes**.
- The session concluded with a **Q&A session**, during which participants actively asked questions and shared personal experiences related to handling disputes in clinical or academic environments.
- **Outcome of the Webinar** The session was attended by over **100 participants**, including **B.Sc. Nursing students and faculty members** from Godavari College of Nursing.
- Participants expressed that the session was **highly relevant, engaging, and thought-provoking**, equipping them with tools and perspectives to handle conflict positively.
- Many students reported a **boost in confidence** to face real-life situations in hospital settings where communication and teamwork are essential.
- Faculty appreciated the practical tips on handling **academic disagreements, student issues, and interprofessional coordination**.
