PULSE POLIO IMMUNIZATION CAMPAIGN REPORT – 2026

Introduction

Pulse Polio Immunization is one of India's most successful public health initiatives aimed at achieving and sustaining a polio-free nation by ensuring that every child below five years of age receives the Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV). The campaign is conducted with the active participation of healthcare professionals, nursing students, ASHA workers, Anganwadi workers, and other health personnel to ensure complete immunization coverage.

Godavari College of Nursing, Jalgaon, actively participated in the Pulse Polio Immunization Campaign organized by the District Health Department, Jalgaon, under the guidance of Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Civil Hospital.

Objectives

- To provide Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV) to every child aged 0–5 years.
- To prevent poliomyelitis and maintain India's polio-free status.
- To identify and vaccinate children who missed vaccination on booth day.
- To provide community-based learning experiences for nursing students.
- To promote awareness regarding the importance of routine immunization and Pulse Polio vaccination.

Orientation Programme

Date: 27 June 2026

Venue: Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Civil Hospital, Mahanagar Palika, Shivaji Nagar, Jalgaon

An orientation programme for the upcoming Pulse Polio Immunization Campaign was organized at Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Civil Hospital, Jalgaon. 32 students along with two faculty members from Godavari College of Nursing actively participated in the programme. The programme commenced at 11:30 a.m. with an inaugural address by **Dr. Sushant Nikumbh**, Chief Medical Officer (CMO), who emphasized the significance of the Pulse Polio Programme in maintaining India's polio-free status.



This was followed by an informative session delivered by **Dr. Swapnil Pravin Sonawane**, RCH Officer, who explained the objectives of the campaign, booth management, house-to-house activity, vaccine administration, documentation procedures, interpersonal communication, and reporting. A practical demonstration of vaccination procedures and campaign activities was conducted by **Ms. Jyotsna Wasnik**, Nursing Officer. The demonstration enabled students to understand vaccine handling, cold chain maintenance, finger marking, recording procedures, and communication with parents. The orientation programme effectively prepared the students for active participation in the campaign.

➤ **Day 1: Booth Immunization Activity**

Date: Sunday, 28 June 2026

The Pulse Polio Campaign officially commenced on 28 June 2026 with booth-based immunization activities conducted at designated vaccination booths across Jalgaon. The nursing students of Godavari College of Nursing were posted at various Pulse Polio booths under the supervision of Medical Officers, ANMs, ASHA workers, and Anganwadi workers.

The students performed the following responsibilities:

- Registration of eligible children (0–5 years)
- Administration of Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV)
- Finger marking after vaccination
- Recording and documentation
- Guiding parents regarding immunization
- Maintaining cleanliness and discipline at the vaccination booth
- Assisting health staff throughout the session

A large number of eligible children received the vaccine on booth day, contributing significantly to the success of the campaign.

➤ **House-to-House Activity**

Duration: 29 June 2026 to 3 July 2026



House-to-house visits were conducted from 29 June to 3 July 2026 to identify children who had missed vaccination on the first day. The nursing students of Godavari College of Nursing worked in collaboration with ASHA workers and health staff. Teams visited households in their assigned areas to identify all children below five years of age who had not received the Oral Polio Vaccine during booth day.

During the house-to-house visits, the students:

- Visited every assigned household systematically.
- Identified children aged 0–5 years.
- Verified the vaccination status of each child.
- Administered Oral Polio Vaccine to eligible unvaccinated children.
- Marked vaccinated children according to campaign guidelines.
- Updated household records and tally sheets.
- Educated parents about the importance of Pulse Polio Immunization.
- Motivated families to participate in future immunization programmes.
- Coordinated with ASHA workers to ensure that no eligible child was left unvaccinated.

































The collaborative efforts of the nursing students and community health workers ensured comprehensive coverage of the remaining eligible children and contributed to the successful completion of the campaign.

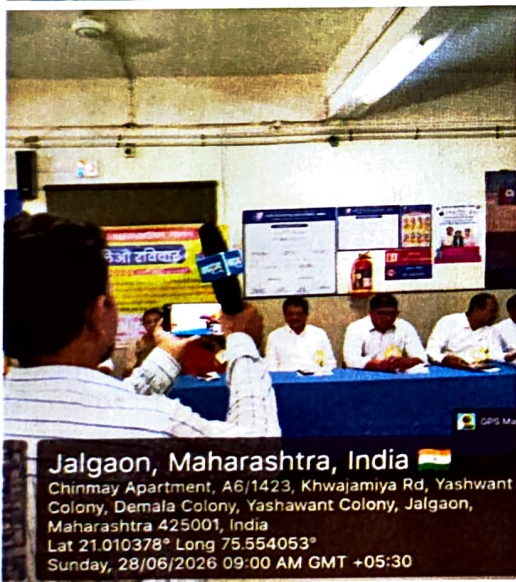


